Lecturers:

Boris Raonić, Civic Alliance, Program Director. Director of the School of Democratic Leadership and founder of one of the first NGOs in Montenegro. Author of a large great number of articles in the field of a dialogue, tolerance and political culture.

Sead Sadiković, journalist and a researcher. Author of several TV shows, documentaries and articles about war crimes committed at the territory of Montenegro.

Vedran Džihić, Assistant Professor at the Faculty of Political Science, University of Vienna, and co-director of the Center for Advanced Studies – CAS. Member of the Council of NGO Civic Alliance.

Zhidas Daskalovski, Professor and Director of School of Public Policies “Mother Teresa” – member of Association of School of Political Studies of the Council of Europe. Author of several scientific papers about the politics in the South East Europe.

Olivera Komar, Faculty of Political Science, University of Montenegro, professor. Received her PhD in 2012 on topic "Voters in Montenegro: Factors of the party and electoral preferences"; and author of more scientific papers.

H.E. Rabii Hantouli - The first resident Ambassador of Palestine to Montenegro. Career diplomat with previous experience as the spokesman for the Palestinian Mission at the United Nations.
